Ask your local pharmacist to recommend medicines to help your symptoms or pain (or both). Fever is a sign the body is fighting the infection and usually gets better by itself in most cases. You can use paracetamol if you or your child are uncomfortable because of a fever. If you develop a severe headache and are sick. If you develop chest pain. If you have difficulty swallowing or are drooling. If you cough up blood. If you are passing little to no urine. If you are feeling a lot worse. <p>Less serious signs that can usually wait until the next available appointment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> If you are not starting to improve a little by the time given in 'Most are better by' Children with middle-ear infection: if fluid is coming out of their ears or they have new deafness. Mild side effects such as diarrhea: seek medical attention if you are concerned

Back-up antibiotic prescription to be collected after days only if you are not starting to feel a little better or you feel worse from:

- Colds, most coughs, sinusitis, ear infections, sore throats, and other infections often get better without antibiotics, as your body can usually fight these off.
- Taking any antibiotics makes bacteria that live inside your body more resistant. This means that antibiotics may not work when you really need them.
- Antibiotics can cause side effects such as rashes, thrush, stomach pains, diarrhoea, reactions to sunlight, other symptoms, or being sick if you drink alcohol with metronidazole.
