



Prescribing of Stoma Collars Position Statement

Hertfordshire and West Essex ICB recommends maximum monthly quantities, dependent on the stoma type, for the prescribing of stoma collars.

Recommendations

Stoma Type	Daily Quantity*	Maximum Monthly Quantity to be Prescribed
Ileostomy	0.5 - 1	30
Colostomy	1-3	90
Urostomy	0.5 - 1	30

^{*}Daily quantity of 0.5 indicates use on alternate days

- New patients using this product should only be prescribed stoma collars after an assessment by a stoma care nurse.
- If ordering in excess of recommended quantities, patients should be referred to their local stoma care nurse for review.

Rationale

- When the stoma bag is changed, the stoma collar will be removed at the same time. Therefore, a new one is required at each bag change.
- Patients with an ileostomy or urostomy usually change their stoma bag daily or on alternate days, therefore requiring 15-30 stoma collars each month.
- Patients with a colostomy may change their stoma bag up to three times a day, so could require 30-90 stoma collars each month.
- Using more than the recommended amount could indicate a stoma related issue that requires a clinical review.

Background

- Stoma Collars adhere to the skin and stoma appliance and are designed to reduce leaks by protecting the base of the stoma and directing the stoma output into the stoma bag.
- These are often used after trying alterative bags to solve leakage issues.
- They are suitable for all stoma types, but are a niche product, so not suitable for all patients.
- There is currently only one brand of stoma collar available to prescribe.
