



# Prescribing of Colostomy, Ileostomy and Urostomy Stoma Bags Position Statement

# Hertfordshire and West Essex ICB recommends maximum monthly quantities, dependent on the stoma type and appliance system, for the prescribing of colostomy, ileostomy and urostomy stoma bags.

#### **Recommendations**

\*An ileostomy bag may be used for a colostomy and (rarely) vice versa – please refer to Stoma Nurse as quantities may differ.

- New patients should only be prescribed colostomy, ileostomy or urostomy stoma bags after an assessment by a stoma care nurse.
- If ordering in excess of recommended quantities, patients should be referred to their local stoma care nurse for review.





## **Rationale**

- Colostomy bags are not drainable or reusable. Usual use: 1-3 bags per day. Flushable bags are only to be used on advice of stoma nurse.
- The flange (base plate for two-piece systems) is not usually changed at every bag change.
- Ileostomy and urostomy bags are drainable.
- Night drainage bags for urostomy patients are drainable. Manufacturers recommend washing the bag daily and replacing after 7 days.
- Using more than the recommended amount could indicate a stoma related issue that requires a clinical review.

### Background

- One-piece appliances are stoma bags, that have an integral adhesive flange as one unit. The adhesive flange is the part of the bag system that is placed around the stoma and attached to the skin. When the bag is removed, the new bag must be reattached to the skin.
- Two-piece appliances have two parts a separate flange (base plate) which attaches to the skin and a separate bag, which the patient can clip onto the flange. Flanges are changed every 2-3 days. The two-piece system can be helpful for patients with sensitive skin. The bag is changed on average about 2 or 3 times a day.
- There is no clinical evidence to support a preferred formulary choice.
- The stoma care nurse is therefore best placed to advise on the appropriate product for the patient, taking into account the stoma type.
