



Self care aware - When should you prescribe?

Pharmacies will only permit the purchase of an over the counter (OTC) preparation **within its licensed indications** and are legally obliged to sell limited quantities of certain medicines. GPs will therefore be required to prescribe an OTC preparation on the NHS in certain circumstances, where clinically appropriate. Due to the extensive range of OTC preparations, the list below has been formulated according to the active ingredients of commonly available OTC preparations and is not brand exhaustive. The checklist also highlights instances where a GP may decide to prescribe an OTC product, but this would still result in the preparation being used in an unlicensed way.

This checklist should be used in conjunction with the national OTC <u>guidance</u>. <u>Please note:</u> <u>This policy does not apply to patients with long term (chronic) conditions.</u>
